## Associate of Arts Degree

## University Parallel Program

**Emphasis: Economics** 

### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The university parallel program in Economics is designed for individuals who intend to complete the first two years of a baccalaureate degree program at Northeast State and then transfer to a four-year college or university to complete the bachelor's degree with a major in Economics. The curriculum includes general education and other selected courses typically required in a baccalaureate degree program in Economics.

### PROGRAM TRANSFERABILITY

This program was designed as a Tennessee Transfer Pathway to UT/TBR four year universities in compliance with Complete College Tennessee Act of 2010. Programs with this designation are intended to provide a seamless transfer between all schools in the Tennessee Board of Regents or University of Tennessee systems. Therefore, students completing this program should expect a seamless transfer to any public university in Tennessee. The program may also transfer to private colleges.

## APPLICATION PROCEDURE

A student desiring to pursue an Associate of Arts degree in Economics must:

- 1. Submit the Northeast State Application for Admission to the Office of Admissions and Records.
- 2. Indicate University Parallel-Associate of Arts degree program in Economics as the desired program on the Northeast State application form.
- 3. See a faculty advisor representing the Economics program prior to registering for classes.
