PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) Certificate program prepares individuals for positions in the Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning industry. Instruction is provided in the maintenance, troubleshooting, and installation of HVAC equipment. Instruction in electrical applications and industrial safety will also be provided.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

A student desiring to pursue a certificate in Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning must:

- 1. Submit the Northeast State Application for Admission to the Office of Admissions and Records.
- 2. Indicate Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning as the desired major on the Northeast State application form.
- 3. See a faculty advisor from Mechanical Technology prior to registering for classes.
