University Parallel Program Emphasis: Media and Communication

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The university parallel program in Media and Communication is designed for individuals who intend to complete the first two years of a baccalaureate degree program at Northeast State and then transfer to East Tennessee State University to complete the bachelor's degree program in Media and Communication. The curriculum includes general education and other selected courses typically required in a baccalaureate degree program in Media and Communication.

PROGRAM TRANSFERABILITY

The Media and Communication program is designed for transfer to East Tennessee State University. The purpose of this area of emphasis is to allow students to complete the first two years of a baccalaureate degree program in media and communication.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

A student desiring to pursue an Associate of Arts degree must:

- 1. Submit the Northeast State Application for Admission to the Office of Admissions and Records.
- 2. Indicate University Parallel-Associate of Arts degree program in Media and Communication as the desired program on the Northeast State application form.
- 3. See a faculty advisor representing the Media and Communication program prior to registering for classes.
