Industrial Process Specialist

A Technical Certificate Program

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Industrial Process Specialist certificate program includes courses that prepare individuals for employment at Eastman Chemical Company. In addition to foundation courses in chemistry and physics, students learn about the industrial environment as it relates to process operations and instrumentation.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

A student desiring to pursue a certificate in Industrial Process Specialist must:

- 1. Submit the Northeast State Application for Admission to the Office of Admissions and Records.
- 2. Indicate Industrial Process Specialist as the desired major on the Northeast State application form.
- 3. See a faculty advisor from the Industrial Process Specialist program prior to registering for classes.

TYPICAL STARTING SALARY

Although beginning salaries may vary depending on individual company policies, the typical starting salary for industrial process assistants in the Northeast Tennessee region is between \$15 and \$20 per hour.

PROGRAM COMPETENCIES

The graduate is competent to:

- 1. Identify, troubleshoot, and operate processes and instrumentation commonly found in chemical process operations.
- 2. Make accurate and precise measurements by identifying instrumentations, terms and symbols, unit conversions, and mechanical, pneumatic, and thermal principles.
- 3. Demonstrate, perform, and adhere to appropriate OSHA safety standards as they apply to chemical process operations.
