(Transfer to East Tennessee State University)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The university parallel program in Social Work is designed for individuals who intend to complete the first two years of a baccalaureate degree program at Northeast State and then transfer to a four-year college or university to complete the bachelor's degree with a major in Social Work. The curriculum includes general education and other selected courses typically required in a baccalaureate degree program in Social Work.

PROGRAM TRANSFERABILITY

The university parallel Associate of Science degree program with an emphasis in Social Work is designed to transfer to East Tennessee State University and may be accepted by other regional colleges and universities. Students wishing to apply at other colleges should consult those colleges' admissions offices for specific academic requirements.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

A student desiring to enroll in the Associate of Science degree program in Social Work - Transfer to ETSU must:

1. Submit the Northeast State Application for Admission to the Office of Admissions and Records.
2. Indicate University Parallel-Associate of Science degree program in Social Work - Transfer to ETSU is the desired program on the Northeast State application form.
3. See a faculty advisor representing the Behavioral and Social Science Division prior to registering for classes.
