### Emphasis: Music

#### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The university parallel program in Music is a program that introduces students to the Music Industry terminology, resources, experience, and fosters the creative skills needed to prepare for a career in the music industry. This degree will increase the opportunities for students to transfer to a four year school with little disruption.

#### PROGRAM TRANSFERABILITY

The Music program is designed for transfer to East Tennessee State University. The purpose of this area of emphasis is to allow students to complete the first two years of a baccalaureate degree program in Music.

#### APPLICATION PROCEDURE

A student desiring to pursue an Associate of Arts degree must:

1. Submit the Northeast State Application for Admission to the Office of Admissions and Records.
2. Indicate University Parallel-Associate of Arts degree program in Music as the desired program on the Northeast State application form.
3. See a faculty advisor representing the Humanities Division prior to registering for classes.
