(Transfer to University of Tennessee - Knoxville)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The university parallel Associate of Arts – General program is designed for individuals who have not selected a major area of study but intend to complete the first two years of a baccalaureate degree program at Northeast State and then transfer to a four-year college or university to complete the Bachelor of Arts degree. The curriculum includes instruction in general education courses which are typically required in a baccalaureate degree program.

PROGRAM TRANSFERABILITY

The university parallel Associate of Arts - General degree program is designed for transfer to the University of Tennessee - Knoxville and many other regional colleges and universities which offer a bachelor's degree program.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

A student desiring to pursue an Associate of Arts – General degree must:

- Submit the Northeast State Application for Admission to the Office of Admissions and Records.
- 2. Indicate University Parallel-Associate of Arts General degree program as the desired program on the Northeast State application form.
- 3. See a faculty advisor representing the university parallel program prior to registering for classes.
