PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Nursing program prepares individuals to become registered nurses. The associate degree nurse is a generalist whose practice encompasses the interrelated roles of care provider, manager of care, and a member of the comprehensive healthcare team. Assessment, caring interventions, clinical decision making, collaboration, communication, managing care, professional behaviors, and teaching and learning characterize this role. The curriculum framework is derived from NLN's eight Core Competencies (2000), selected NLN Core Values (2010), and ANA's professional Standards (2015).

The Nursing program is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, Inc. (ACEN).

NURSING PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The Nursing program has specific admission criteria, and admission to Northeast State does not guarantee admission to this program. For consideration of admission into the Nursing program, students must possess a minimum Grade Point Average of 3.0 after completing a minimum of 12 credit hours of coursework required for the Associate of Applied Science degree Nursing program or possess a minimum ACT score of 23 in each of the following areas: Math, Reading, Science, and English. Biological science courses previously taken must have been completed in the last 10 years.

** Must be accepted into the Nursing program to register for any NRSRG courses.

*** A specific number of clinic hours may be required to qualify for NCLEX-RN. Students, who reside in Virginia, must complete Virginia Board of Nursing requirements in order to write for the NCLEX-RN which includes a minimum of 500 clock hours of direct client care supervised by qualified faculty. NRSRG 1210, Nursing Special Topics-Clinical, provides students with an additional 90 clock hours of clinical which fulfills this mandate. [18VAC90-19-140]

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

A student desiring to pursue an Associate of Applied Science degree in Nursing must:

1. Submit the Northeast State Application for Admission to the Office of Admissions and Records.
2. Indicate Nursing as the desired program on the Northeast State application form.*
3. Seek advisement from the student's assigned nursing advisor to establish a program plan of study.
4. Complete all courses required for the degree with a grade of "C" or higher.
5. Apply and be accepted to the Nursing Program.

**As this program is a selective-admissions program, students will be initially enrolled in the Associate of Science in Pre-Allied Health degree program. Once a student makes application and is accepted into a selective-admissions program, they will be enrolled into that specific program.*

TYPICAL JOB OPPORTUNITIES

The associate of applied science degree in Nursing offers a lifetime of career opportunities. Employment in hospital settings, extended care facilities, public/community health, and ambulatory care are just a few career options available. Graduates may also choose nursing education within schools or community centers or enter a more specialized field such as physicians' offices or emergency departments.
