Emphasis: Pre-Teacher Education - K-5 Education

(Transfer to East Tennessee State University)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Associate of Science degree program in K-5 education is designed for individuals who intend to complete the first two years of a baccalaureate degree program at Northeast State and then transfer to a four-year college or university to complete the bachelor's degree program in K-5 education. The curriculum includes general education and other selected courses typically required in a baccalaureate degree program in education, K-5. Students who successfully complete the program and meet other requirements may receive state teacher licensure.

PROGRAM TRANSFERABILITY

The university parallel Associate of Science degree program with an emphasis in K-5 Education is designed to transfer to East Tennessee State University and may be accepted by other regional colleges and universities. Students wishing to apply at other colleges should consult those colleges' admissions offices for specific academic requirements.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

A student desiring to pursue an Associate of Science degree in K-5 Education must:

1. Submit the Northeast State Application for Admission to the Office of Admissions and Records.
2. Indicate University Parallel-Associate of Science degree program in K-5 Education (Transfer to ETSU) as the desired program on the Northeast State application form.
3. See a faculty advisor representing the Teacher Education program prior to registering for classes.
